

### SENIOR SNAP MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT

Since I started in March, Senior SNAP Outreach has made a positive impact in the lives of more than 20 seniors that were struggling with food insecurities, not to mention the 60+ seniors that had already been reached by my predecessor, Rachel Tate. This is due in part to the efforts of our churches in seeking out these seniors and



connecting them to our ministry. I am excited to announce that we have two churches with individuals who have joined with us as community partners. These partnering churches are Lorena FBC and Bosqueville Baptist Church. As community partners these lay volunteers will be able to reach those struggling with food insecurities far more efficiently than I could by myself. They have also established themselves as excellent tools for outreach ministry in their churches. I am anxious to see how God will use them for His Kingdom.
