
Rene Maciel and Tom Gutierrez will share why and how **BLOCK PARTIES** really are an effective evangelism tool.

The start of a new semester is always exciting. Thursday morning Collegiate Ministry (CM) gatherings for donuts, coffee, orange juice and fellowship have offered students a brief spiritual respite from the rigors of classroom and lab work.

been vital to our weekly discussions as he questions and challenges students to express their thoughts about verses. He encourages them to examine and express ways their faith has been challenged or strengthened.
