FROM YOUR DIRECTOR

What is a church? Some commonly refer to it as the building with a steeple on top. Others talk of the church as a group of people who meet together locally to worship. The Apostle Paul frequently called it the "body of Christ."

Last year, a group of our wonderful church leaders worked together as the WRBA Church Strengthening Team to assemble a resource for your church! This resource is in the form of a 100-page booklet. Or you can obtain it digitally.



It is intended to help your congregation see itself in a new light: as if it were a human body. It is appropriately entitled The Body of Christ: A Church Strengthening Process.


Throughout the book you will find stories of real churches here in Central Texas that demonstrate healthy and/or weak body systems. There are 40 daily devotionals that can be shared with your entire congregation via email or printed copies. There are sermon ideas based on the 12 human body systems, and there are some assessments at the conclusion to help you and your congregation figure out which body systems in your church are working well, and which body systems might need some extra attention in the months to come.

Our desire is that every church in central Texas be a healthy and thriving congregation. None are perfect. And every church could use a little bit of a "tune up."

Here is one example of how a human body system can be compared to a church body: The sensory system is the body's connection to the outside world through sight, smell, taste, touch, and hearing. This system allows the body to move and react in positive ways to external changes. In the church, the sensory system might be individuals who perceive and interpret the outside world to inside the body so timely adjustments can be made. This prophetic voice, or regular strategy planning process, or discovery process interprets what is happening in the community so the church can respond appropriately. This illustrates just one of the 12 human body systems that are also common to the church.

The Body of Christ: A Church Strengthening Process is a free resource to you and your church just for the asking.

COLLEGIATE MINISTRY SPOTIGHT

Were you aware that of the students who enter community and technical colleges in any semester, approximately 70% of them fail to maintain a sense of community through attending a local church? It is also unfortunate and alarming that students enrolled in potentially lucrative technical programs leave before graduating. Their departure is often unrelated to ability to master the specific technological skills or the



curriculum that supports that technology. Instead, they are leaving due to a variety of other real-world challenges. Frequently marital, family, housing and/or employment issues are the barriers to program completion.

Research shows that students are far more likely to overcome those challenges and go on to complete postsecondary studies if they are active participants in extra-curricular activities.

Through the Waco Regional Baptist Association (WRBA) Collegiate Ministry, students have many and varied opportunities to connect with faculty and classmates in the campus community; to serve alongside members of the community in and near the campus; and to grow spiritually through connecting with mentors from local churches.

Specifically, students are invited to attend and participate in Baptist Student Ministry (BSM) programs that include Bible study, lunches provided by member churches, and periodic worship and fellowship. In addition, BSM is the gateway to a host of other community resources including childcare, counseling, housing and employment assistance, to name just a few.

This is an exciting time to minister at TSTC and your church can be a part of it. We need churches to lead Bible Study, worship and fellowship, host lunches, and provide avenues to church and community resources.
