FROM YOUR DIRECTOR

In January of 2016 our Association completed a strategic planning process that called for the creation of four new ministry teams to serve the needs of our WRBA congregations: Church Member Health, Church Technology, Church Evangelism, and Church Protection. Since then, we have been working to put together the new teams and get them up and running. The Lord has been with us and answered our prayers. As

of this month, all four teams are now operating and helping our churches in their respective areas of expertise. I wish I had space here to detail how it was God who has put these teams together in a miraculous fashion. In each case, the Lord has led very qualified, passionate brothers and sisters to lead and serve on each team. The last team to get started was the Church Technology Team.

I have been praying about finding the right person to lead the Church Technology Team for months. On February 26, I filled in for Oak Grove Baptist Church Pastor Dennis Larson, speaking on how healing is a part of our modern church's ministry. After the service, several people stayed and visited briefly about what the WRBA does and about the sermon. Three months later, Jason Reynolds called and scheduled a time to visit. He simply said, "The Lord told me to call you. I want my life to make a difference." We visited, and I learned that he is an IT expert who runs his own consulting firm. He has vast experience in marketing, hardware, software, and helping large organizations put the whole technology package together. He agreed to lead our new church technology team. A few days later, a WRBA pastor asked if we knew anyone who could help their church build a new website. "YES!" I responded. Jason connected this church with a capable person within a day.

There are two things I want to prompt you to do today: (1) Pray about who you know that could join this Church Technology Team and let me know who that is. And (2) Look over the list of our ministry teams (page 2) and pray through one day for them that God would strengthen, encourage and use them to transform our churches and our communities for the Glory of God.

HUNGER MINISTRY UPDATE

After a year of being in the position of Hunger Ministry Coordinator, either myself or one of our hunger team members has had the opportunity and privilege of making contact with 63 of our member churches to learn about their ministry to the community and whether that might include hunger ministry. Here is a snapshot of what hunger ministry looks like in our member churches:



- 20 Churches Donate: time, food or money to a local non-profit or community wide effort
- 17 Food Pantries: eight of these are partnerships with other churches or non-profits
- 16 Meal Programs: including Wednesday night community meals, summer meals, holiday meals and meals at apartments, hotels, schools and nursing homes
- 13 Food Delivery/Distribution Programs: meals and food are delivered to homes, distributed in parks, on holidays, to seniors, and through non-profit partnerships
- **5** Backpack Programs: in three school districts and five schools
- 3 Community Gardens: multi-church and church/non-profit partnerships, produce available to church members and community residents, canning demonstrations
- 2 SNAP Assistance Sites: churches trained to assist community members with SNAP (food stamps) applications to make their food budget stretch further
- 1 Advocacy Engagement: engaging the conversation about hunger at a state and national level
- 84% of churches with hunger ministries are partnering with other churches or local organizations!
