MCC COLLEGIATE MINISTRY UPDATE

College ministry at McLennan Community College (MCC) is off to a great start! We began the school year by setting up a table at the school's Activities Fair and had several students sign up to receive more information about the Baptist Student Ministry (BSM). Since the Activities Fair, we have provided free lunches every Wednesday. We started with about 15 students in attendance and have grown up to at least 25 every Wednesday! Every week we have a Bible study on campus and are walking



through the book of John. Several students come every Thursday to dive deeper into God's Word. These students have been so insightful and encouraging throughout this semester. They are eager to be involved, even in the midst of midterms.

I have been so overwhelmed with the eagerness and acceptance the students have shown me as we build relationships with one another and with students on campus. We have about 10 student leaders who have helped tremendously with events and coming up with new and exciting ideas. Our first event was in September when we had "See You at the Pole" and our first kickoff event. "See You at the Pole" was at 7:00am, and surprisingly we had more

than 10 students show up! It was a time of meeting new people and praying for their school and needs. Later that day we served pizza to anyone at the school, and 20 large pizzas were gone in 20 minutes! Many students came for the free pizza but stayed around for the community. We played games, and students hung around for more than two hours! I cannot even describe how wonderful this semester is going, but there is still more work to do.
