- Hunger Ministry Spotlight –

As I go into the different hunger ministries in our WRBA churches, it never ceases to amaze me how magnificent God's Kingdom on earth is and how many workers are laboring to bring in the harvest! Last week I met Pantry Director Helen Lewis and her dedicated volunteers at the Shepherd's Heart sponsored food pantry at Carver Park Baptist Church. Located near the Estella Maxey federal housing complex, this group of about 12 volunteers diligently serves 40-60 families every other week.



"We've seen the numbers grow rapidly over the last

year or two," said Lewis. "We feel blessed that we can provide a service to the community in this way."

The doors open promptly at 10:00am on the first and third Friday of each month, but the volunteers work many hours before that picking up food from Shepherd's Heart food drop-off that comes from the Capital Area Food Bank, stocking the food in their church and boxing up 10-12 home delivery boxes. All the volunteers wear the same T-shirt, boosting morale and creating unity while also being easily identifiable to the many guests that come seeking assistance. After a brief interview that collects information required by the Capital Area Food Bank, the guests are guided through a well organized line of tables piled high with varieties of bread, fresh produce, meat and canned goods. Guests can select items themselves and are assisted to their car if help is needed. When the ministry began several years ago, they only saw half the amount of people that come today.

Lewis has served the Waco community for more than 30 years in the Health and Human Services field. She now uses her gift of administration to organize and encourage church volunteers. A humble, soft-spoken woman, she hesitates to talk about herself, always giving God and others all the praise!

Since the ministry's beginning, James Jones has driven the van with boxes of food for the community. He volunteered for many years and learned the ropes at Shepherd's Heart main location. When his church opened a pantry, he assisted in any way he could. Jones enjoys the ministry of taking food to neighbors who do not drive. He spends time with them in prayer and conversation. He knows he is often the only one they will see in a week. Jones makes sure each one is dealt with in a special way, discerning what God has to share with them and giving freely of his time and love.

This family of believers is exhibiting love of the Father with every seed they sow.
