Whenever we worship our Lord, we are acknowledging that we are part of a larger community. That community is bigger and broader than our particular congregation. It



NEW WRBA STAFF

It has been a wonderful summer with Hunger Ministry at the WRBA. We are partnering with Tri-Cities Ministries to have conversations about a shared food pantry in the Elm Mott community. Previously, three local churches each operated separate pantries. The pastors and a number of members from Elm Mott FBC and two other local congregations have been meeting since May of this year to consider what it would look like to



coordinate a shared hunger ministry in the community. I am grateful for their careful and thoughtful consideration of how to partner in a way that would respect the differences between denominations while responding to the common goal of caring for those in their community who hunger.

This summer we have also had the privilege to welcome two new members to our Hunger Committee. In May we welcomed Rev. Ryan Busby, pastor of Bosqueville Baptist Church, to our committee. We were grateful to also have Lila Chapa, a member of Primera Iglesia Bautista de Waco, join our committee last month. Members of the Hunger Committee have worked alongside Bethany and myself this year to create a statement of purpose for hunger ministry at the WRBA, as well as, a strategy for how to best serve our congregations who have or who are interested in working to alleviate hunger.

Last, but certainly not least, we are delighted [to welcome our social work intern for the 2016-2017 school year. Kelsey Miller is a concentration year MSW student serving in WRBA's hunger ministry. She formerly worked at the Texas Hunger Initiative, where she enjoyed collaborating with diverse community organizations to design common solutions to child hunger and other hunger-related challenges. Kelsey is



originally from the Chicago area and first moved to Waco in 2011 to work at the World Hunger Relief Farm, where she quickly fell in love with Waco and its quirks. She loves backyard gardening, cooking, reading, exploring new places and enjoying time with her husband and dogs. We hope you have the opportunity to meet Kelsey this year and are grateful for this now five year partnership with the Garland School of Social Work at Baylor University.


