many bright ideas for good ministries, but most of them end up in a field of discarded and forgotten good intentions without ever touching many lives.


Our walk with God must be characterized by perseverance if we desire to be part of that 'great cloud of witnesses' that have gone before us and shown us the path of living by faith.
