In church life, there are a host of details that just must be done for the church to continue meeting, ministering, and preaching the Gospel. Among these more mundane aspects of church ministry included in "taking care of business" are:


- Keeping current Constitution & Bylaws, Articles of Incorporation, policies, personnel records, and minutes of meet-
- Keeping current and adequate insurance (*From a company* that specifically insures churches) for properties and activities and personnel of the church.
- Reviewing safety procedures in all areas.
- •Keeping equipment, building maintenance, and routine repairs up-to-date.
- •Keeping good financial records and complying with payroll and tax laws.
- •Dealing with all personnel in a professional manner with transparency and respect and in a Christian spirit.

Although these aspects of "church work" are perhaps not as satisfying as preaching riveting sermons or putting together transformative worship services, they are essential if the church continues doing ministry well.

I try to let you know of training opportunities for all of these aspects of church ministry. In this issue of our newsletter, we are letting you know of a Ministers' Taxes Seminar.


