FROM YOUR DIRECTOR

This morning, as I write these words, my heart has been drawn to Psalm 95 verse 7. "For He is our God and we are the people of His pasture, the flock under His care. Today, if only you would hear his voice."

There is so much to meditate upon in this verse, but I would like to make a few brief comments on two concepts found here:

- There is a "we" in the Scriptures that is very broad but it is distinctive. "We are His sheep" indicates there are many of us in this beautiful pasture. Whenever I hear pastors speak on unity, (think John 17) it is almost always limited to *this congregation*. But in Scripture, the "we" is always larger than one community of faith. It is all of those who fear, trust and love God. Our vision of His flock really needs an adjustment of perspective.
- As sheep in His pasture, we are "under His care." Our health, our security, our very lives are in His hands. He is a good shepherd. He wants us to thrive. I understand that He is concerned about our total wellbeing. The fact that many of us are very sickly should grab our attention. The Church Health Reader has published a Guide for Clergy Health that helps us assess our total wellbeing. I would encourage you to click on the document and take a few days to work through the questions to discover where you might be cooperating with our good Shepherd in your own wellbeing, and where you might be resisting His care and provision. We raised goats for several years while we lived in Gatesville, and I observed that despite our vigilance to provide fresh water and healthy feed, some of the goats regularly chose to leave the fenced in pasture and go do their own thing. As a metaphor, I think that works to see us as goats in His pasture, and our best interest is in staying

within His pasture and accepting from His hand the good things He is delighted to give us.

Are you enjoying the blessings of being a sheep under His care today? I pray you are.

I hope each of you had a wonderful Thanksgiving with your family and friends and are looking forward to Christmas just around the corner. The birth of Jesus is an event like no other. His life changed the course of history and His birth brought joy into the world and salvation to all who know Him. Joy to the world, the Lord has come!

Here are some highlights of the Church Health & Hunger Ministries over the last month:

We have 23 churches and 26 liaisons involved in *Faith Health Waco*. These include four Spanish-speaking churches, four African American churches and the following denominations (Baptist, Catholic, Lutheran, Methodist, Non-Denominational, Pentecostal, and Presbyterian).

We had our first "Meet & Greet" in October where Faith Health Liaisons had the opportunity to talk with each other and with the Community Health Workers.

Referral systems are in place at Baylor Scott & White, Providence and the Health District (Community Health Workers). This system works two ways - Case Management, Pastoral Care and Community Health Workers refer patients directly to Faith Health Liaisons, or Faith Health Liaisons can directly contact their Faith Health Coordinator at each hospital and the Community Health Workers supervisor. Please contact Sarah Kranick, Faith in Action Coordinator to register for the upcoming Faith Community Caregiver Training scheduled for December 8th from 9:30 a.m. -12:00 p.m. at Baylor Scott & White Hillcrest. We have already started receiving referrals!! Here is one example: A Case Manager/Social Worker referred a patient to Faith Health Waco for a transportation need. She had a patient that had been discharged from the hospital and needed a ride to their physician in Temple for a follow-up visit. The church closest to the patient's home in the Faith Health Waco program, was contacted. The Faith Health Liaison for Western Heights Baptist Church is Libby Day and she, and Pastor Osborne, found someone to take this patient to his appointment the very next day! Hallelujah!! I just saw the social worker that referred this patient to us and she told me the patient was so thrilled and grateful and is looking forward to future contact with Western Heights Baptist. Thank you Libby, Pastor Osborne and your church member who transported this patient for truly being the hands and feet of Jesus.
